Spellings will be sent home every Friday and tested on the following Tuesday.

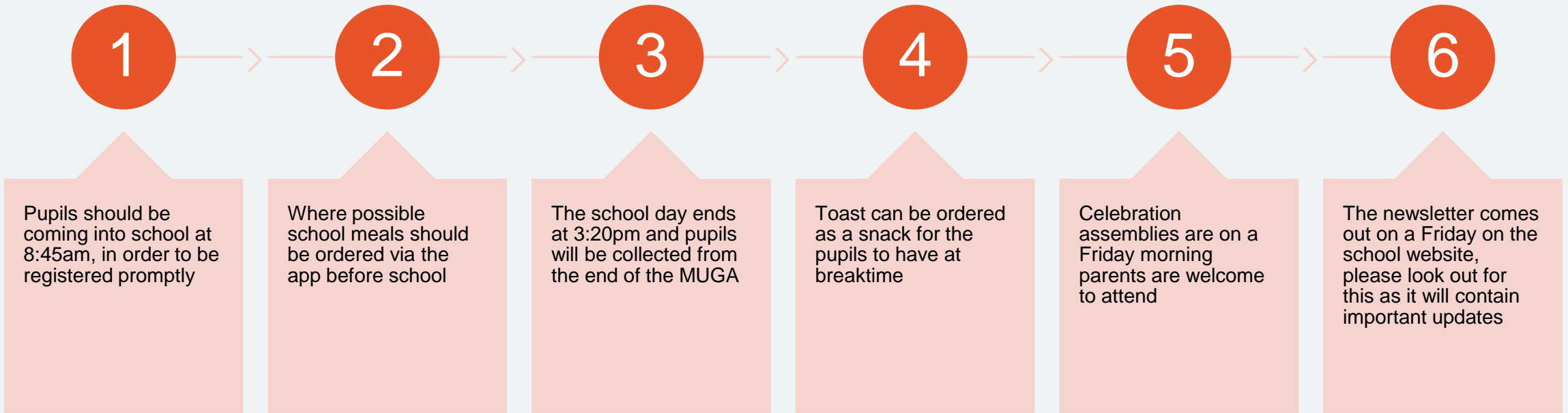
The expectation is that children read every night to parents for 10 minutes and the reading record is signed. Books will be changed/added to on Mondays and Fridays.
