Thank you for all your responses to the **Awards letter and questionnaire**. All of your, and the children's views, are being taken into account ready for a few tweaks and changes in September. Here is the link if haven't already responded. [Awards Consultation – Fill in form](#)

In answer to some queries over the Award types and reasons. As stated on the letter, House Points are awarded to all pupils for a wide range of reasons, including effort, behaviour, work in class, home learning including Reading and Spelling as well as making positive choices. The "High Achievers" reflect those children who are consistently demonstrating these expectations, and as such, they are open to all pupils.

The explanation for most of the Awards is on Pg 3 of the behaviour policy 2025 – 2026 on the school website:

Rewards have a motivational role and these should take the following forms:

- 1. A weekly celebration assembly (Friday mornings) at which Team House point awards will be read out by the House Captains every week and logged on the House Board. Individual badges for High Achiever will be read out by the House Captains and distributed by the Class Teachers back in class*
- 2. Half-termly Shining Star awards (one 'role-model' child from each class whose behaviour is exemplary). Photographs of all the 'Shining stars' will be displayed prominently in the entrance hall.*
- 3. Good work in books = effort stickers/house points
Good behaviour/attitude = house-points (1 to maximum of 5 with a Shining Star awards of 10 points).*
- 4. Verbal praise (describing the specific good behaviour) is the main and most common 'reward' for good effort, behaviour & relationships (encouraging intrinsic rather than extrinsic motivation) – this can be publicly given (class or whole school) or privately (affirmation) or to parents at the end of each day or week. For some children this will be a more formal meeting at the end of the week at which pupil and parents listen to the unqualified positive praise of teaching staff (describing specific behaviour which may have been recorded in a praise journal).*
- 5. Class based reward systems devised for individual cohorts by teachers, support staff and pupils (e.g. marble/token collection in return for House points, postcards home etc.).*
- 6. House points are awarded and collated at the end of each week using the Trackitlights software system. Badges are awarded to the highest achiever in each house, in each class every week. There are 4 certificates which can be awarded through the year.
Bronze - Expected achievement at the end of the Autumn term (50 House points)
Silver – Expected achievement at the end of the Spring term (100)
Gold – Expected achievement at the end of the Summer term (200)
Platinum – 300 points Approximately 10% of each class by the end of the year
Diamond – 400 points Approximately 5% of each class by the end of the year
Random acts of Kindness awards – Can be awarded by any member of staff for children who you notice doing something for someone else. A weekly certificate is given out for this.*

Added in 2026, the new Mission Award was introduced in February and is awarded to children whose actions reflect our Mission : 'Kind Hearts, Bright Minds, One Family'.



Leyland Boot Room

The Boot Room has been set up to support children by providing access to football boots and other sports footwear that have been generously donated by members of the community. To date, they have distributed over 450 free pairs, helping ensure that as many children as possible can take part in sport without the barrier of cost. Recently, they supported the Leyland Festival, where they were able to give away over 50 pairs of boots. As a result, their current stock has reduced

significantly and they now only have around 20 pairs remaining.

If any family has any unwanted football boots or sports shoes that they would be willing to donate. Any contributions would make a real difference and help the Boot Room continue to support local children. The boots can be brought to the School Office.

Breaktime Snacks

In line with updated guidance for schools regarding eating and the prevention of choking incidents, all children now eat their breaktime snacks under adult supervision in the classroom before going out to play. To ensure that this can be managed safely and efficiently, whilst still allowing sufficient time for learning, playtime and staff breaks, we will be introducing the following arrangements from September:

EYFS and Key Stage 1 : Pre-paid toast, or the free fruit provided by school

Parents do not need to send a snack for children in EYFS or KS1.

Key Stage 2 Pre-paid toast, or a piece of fruit, or veg sticks. No other snacks will be permitted so please do not provide anything other than what is listed.

We would also ask parents to ensure that children have a healthy breakfast before coming to school each morning, as this will help them stay focused and ready to learn throughout the day.

- Please ensure all hair accessories are red or blue; large bows, intricate headbands or clips, and unnaturally coloured weaves or hairpieces are not permitted.

- To help your child have easy access to water, please make sure **their water bottle is no bigger than 23cm around (standard size).**

Larger bottles won't be allowed in the classroom as we don't have space to store them.

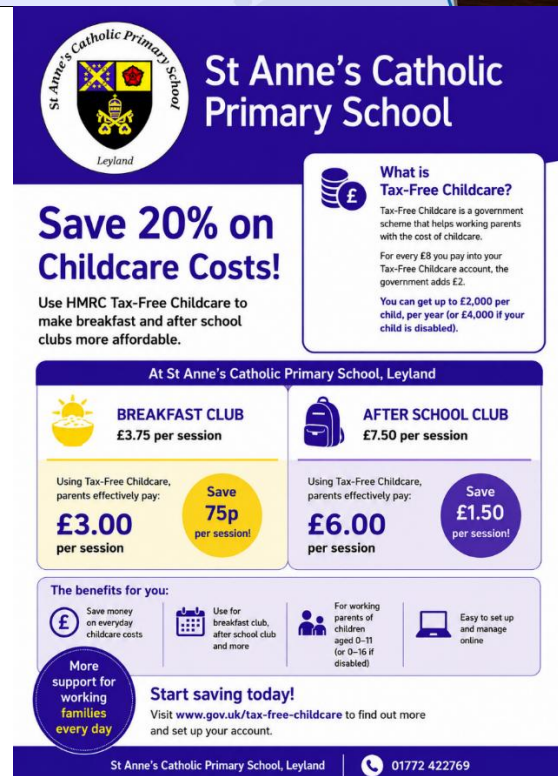

New school App

You will have received an email from Juniper Education inviting you to download a new School App. Please follow the instructions on the email. We will still be utilising our old App until the summer



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holidays, but, from September, everything will move over to the new one. This has been necessary due to our Website technical upgrade. Please do call into the school if you having any difficulties with this.

Appointments

We have noticed a significant increase in the number of pupils being taken out of school for appointments during the school day. While we understand that some medical and emergency appointments are unavoidable, we ask all parents and carers to make every effort to arrange routine appointments outside of school hours, such as after school, during holidays or at weekends – as the school staff are required to do for themselves and their families. Even a single hour out of school can result in missed teaching, learning discussions and important class activities, and repeated absences quickly add up to a substantial loss of learning time across the year. Moving forward, pupils will only be authorised to leave school during the day for emergency or unavoidable appointments, and evidence of the appointment (such as a letter, text confirmation or appointment card) will be required. Thank you for your continued support in helping us maximise every child's learning time and attendance.

Medications

If your child suffers with asthma and has an inhaler, please bring a labelled inhaler to the school office to complete the medical forms for us to retain in school.

Crisis and Resilience Fund

Free School Meals – Holiday Support Update

What's changed?

From April 2026, the Government introduced a new Crisis and Resilience Fund (CRF), replacing the previous Household Support Fund.

As part of this change, Lancashire County Council free school meal food vouchers via schools are no longer provided during school holidays. The vouchers made available to access HAF activities will still be available during the Christmas, Easter and Summer holidays.

Why have holiday food vouchers ended?

The new Crisis and Resilience Fund has been designed to offer a more flexible and long-term approach to support, rather than providing set vouchers.

What is the Crisis and Resilience Fund?

Instead of fixed support like vouchers, the CRF focuses on:

- Supporting families facing urgent financial difficulties
- Helping people achieve longer-term stability and resilience
- Preventing repeat financial hardship
- Assisting with sudden or unexpected changes in circumstances

What is the aim of this new approach?

The fund is designed to:

- Provide help when it's needed most
- Support families to regain financial stability
- Reduce the risk of future financial difficulties
- Offer support that is tailored to individual circumstances
- Combine immediate help with longer-term support

When will the fund be available?



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The Crisis and Resilience Fund will be available locally from late June 2026.

Active Camps Holiday Provision

Active Camps is school holiday provision designed to support families with funded or low-cost provision for their children. The Council is offering activities in Bamber Bridge and Penwortham. The activities offer at least 2 hours of fun and physical activity, as well as the children receiving a healthy lunch. To access the funded provision, children must be in receipt of benefit-related free school meals, or family be able to evidence the need for the funded support.

Uniform

Please ensure all uniform is labelled so any lost items can be returned. If anyone requires any 'good as new' uniform, we have a good stock in school of generously donated items so please speak to Lisa or ask at the office. Any further donations would be gratefully received.

Nut-Free School

As we are seeing an increase of children with nut allergies, St Anne's is now a 'Nut-free' school.



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Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially lifethreatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy, it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts e.g., Nutella, can trigger an anaphylactic shock which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties. As a school we have a responsibility to keep all pupils, staff and visitors safe reducing any risk of harm so pupils, staff and visitors must not bring products containing nuts into school either in lunch boxes or as snacks.

The following items must NOT be brought into school in packed lunches or for snacks:

- Packets of nuts
- Peanut butter/Nutella sandwiches
- Cereals / Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Sesame seed rolls (children allergic to nuts may also have a severe reaction to sesame)
- Cakes made with nuts

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely. No items containing nuts are prepared in the school kitchen.

Attendance and Punctuality Reminder

Good punctuality is essential so children do not miss valuable learning time at the start of the school day.

Please be reminded that if a pupil arrives after the registers have closed, this is recorded with a '**U**' **code** (unauthorised late). A '**U**' code counts as an **unauthorised absence**.

Unauthorised absences occur when a pupil is late after registers close, and it is these unauthorised absences that are added to other absence data. Ten late marks in a term are recorded as the equivalent of one full day of unauthorised absence.

Attendance is monitored in line with statutory guidance. Where unauthorised absences — including those due to late arrival after registers close — combine with other absence data and reach set thresholds, this may result in further action, including fixed penalty notices.
